## Course Description

Students will perform various works of music throughout the year. Emphasis is on technique, skill development, and practice. Students who select band, a performance oriented class, as a course of study may have to purchase various books depending on level (as determined by their middle school band director) by the third week of school. This class meets three times a cycle, with the additional small group lessons held during the school day. Small group lessons will begin in the third week of school; these are also mandatory and part of the students' grade. Attendance at mandatory co-curricular school rehearsals and performances held before, during or after school are a required aspect of this course; non-attendance at these rehearsals and performances is not an option. Please communicate with Miss Gamber about any discrepancies with scheduling. The bands perform a minimum of two mandatory times each school year (Winter and Spring concerts); however, students are expected to perform at all in-school assembly and evening programs scheduled by the director or the school district. In addition to currently participating in all public performances and scheduled lesson settings, at least one year of prior playing experience is required to be in this class.
*If any after school rehearsals are needed, students participating in sports will split time if there is not a game.*

## Classroom Objectives

The students will:

- Learn to listen to music and analyze or describe what you hear
- Develop an appreciation of all forms of music
- Play as a group
- Learn musical vocabulary terms to guide performances
- Learn to sight read and develop better rhythmic reading skills
- Understand harmony versus unison
- Learn and play the $\mathrm{Bb}, \mathrm{Eb}, \mathrm{Ab}$, \& F Major concert scales
- Understand the different musical genres
- Perform in all mandatory concerts and dress rehearsals
- Complete class and concert reflections
- Practice good breathing and performance techniques


## Grading

Grading will be determined by the following:

- Concert performances (Audience etiquette during performances will be taken into consideration)
- Preparation/participation and classwork in band rehearsals and small group lessons
- Knowledge of band music and lesson book material for quizzes and exams
- Assignments/evidence of practice on students' instruments

Students must attend all dress rehearsals in order to be eligible to play in the performance. If a student does not participate in the dress rehearsals(s) they will be assessed a zero for both missing the dress rehearsal(s) and for failure to be eligible for participation in the performance(s). Students who participate in the dress rehearsal(s) but fail to participate in the performance(s) will be assessed a grade of zero for the performance(s) only.

- Students may be asked to purchase the next level book (Essential Elements - Book 2)

Students are responsible to bring their lesson books to band rehearsals and small group lessons. Parents, please make sure that students have the Essential Elements Book 1 OR 2 from last year (specific to his/her instrument).

## Instrument Selection \& Needed Accessories

The following is a list of brands and model numbers that are recommended for our students. There are some other acceptable choices, but only a few; certain instruments can keep your child from reaching his or her full potential, and in some cases, hold them back considerably. I ask that you contact me before buying another/new type of instrument. Most instrument rental companies will be including the required beginner mouthpiece and accessories with most of the instruments. However, in the case that you purchase an instrument elsewhere, the required mouthpiece and accessories are listed next to the instrument. Students will also need access to a tuner and metronome; there are several free tuner/metronome apps available for iOS and Android and there are links to online tools on my website. Stand-alone tuner/metronomes can be purchased at a local music store or online, but I suggest just using the freebies!

## What constitutes working and playing condition?

1. Mouthpiece
a. No dents, scrapes or gouges on sides, in the cup or at the bottom opening
b. Plating is in good condition
c. Fits easily into the instrument mouthpiece receiver
2. Valves
a. Outside of valves (the casing) is free of dents
b. Can open to oil and move freely with no hesitations
3. Slides
a. All slides should move freely
b. All slides lubricated
4. Dents
a. There should be no dents that interfere with valves, slides or tone production
5. Water Keys
a. Spring and cork are tight against the instrument to form an airtight seal
6. Cases
a. Should provide adequate protection against denting
b. Fits tightly into case to prevent shifting while carrying
c. Secure place for mouthpiece and accessories so that they do not hit the instrument
**All instruments are subject to teacher approval to make sure that your student can be successful in playing and performing!**
